While it wasn't the first rock song to hit the charts, it was anthemic for a growing trend of young rebels from the 1950s. The song encouraged young people to stay up late and party, controversial and revolutionary for their time. Berry's 'Johnny B. Goode' told the story of a New Orleans boy who grew up driving a rock band. Actually, Berry used "Johnny" to sing his rebel experiences as one of the world's first rock stars.
